Inspirational message for April - By Lynn Collins

Elder Gerrit W. Gong of the Quorum of Twelve Apostles has written a new book titled <u>The Shepherd</u> and <u>The Lamb.</u> At first blush one might presume that the Shepherd is, of course, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, the "Good Shepherd" of the *New Testament*, and the Lamb is one of us who has gone astray. However, as you read further you discover that the Lamb is also the Savior, for He is in truth "The Lamb of God".

Elder Gong observes:

"Jesus Christ as the Shepherd of Israel gathers His people in all places and circumstances into the safety of His fold on both sides of the veil."

The Savior ministers and strengthens, and He asks us to join Him in ministering and strengthening one another. We do so in our various callings and by simply being good friends and neighbors, The Savior forgives, and commands us to forgive one another as He forgives us.

In the great Council in Heaven He was chosen by the Father to be our Redeemer. He told the Father "Send me and the glory be Thine forever." Inspirational message for May - by Rebecca Simmons

In his most recent conference address, our prophet encouraged us to enjoy the blessings of temples. He refers to the dedicatory prayer of the Kirtland Temple, which is recorded in Doctrine and Covenants section 109. He shares promises from that dedicatory prayer about what will happen to those who serve and worship in the house of the Lord. He states,

"They can expect to receive answers to prayer, personal revelation, greater faith, strength, comfort, increased knowledge, and increased power.

Time in the temple will help you to think celestial and to catch a vision of who you really are, who you can become, and the kind of life you can have forever. Regular temple worship will enhance the way you see yourself and how you fit into God's magnificent plan. I promise you that.

We are also promised that in the temple we may 'receive a fulness of the Holy Ghost.' Imagine what that promise means in terms of having the heavens open for each earnest seeker of eternal truth.
