

Inspirational message for July - Jeff Simmons

This past week, many in the ward and citizens from our immediate area, were able to assist in helping refugee families and, specifically, their children get backpacks, a water bottle and school supplies for this upcoming school year. Some of us acted as guides to help the children through the process. Others served as translators, and still others dispensed a little joy for the children in the form of creamsicles, cotton candy, pizza and ice water on the sweltering 103-degree day. One of the families I guided through the process was brought to the event by their older sister Yasmin... a 20-year-old. They were all refugees from Somalia and had been in the U.S. for 12 years. These children were beautiful... each with dark black hair, radiant black skin, and beaming eyes which radiated the excitement for their "Christmas in August". They patiently filed through crushing lines which often swelled to 200-300 long and 5 deep, just to receive their backpack, a water bottle and school supplies.

What good will these simple things do? And what good will the small acts of service rendered by those volunteers bring about? Perhaps, Yasmin provides an answer. In her 8 years here, Yasmin has become totally fluent in English. She has graduated from high school. She is now in her 3rd year at the University
