From the editor...

I appreciated the wonderful testimonies shared in Sacrament Meeting last Sunday. I felt the testimony shared by Bishop Randle at the beginning of the meeting set a wonderful tone. He mentioned the way some might think the bishop is responsible for increasing someone's faith. But that is not something a bishop can do. He mentioned the call from the Book of Mormon, that we are to be agents to act, and not objects to be acted upon. He encouraged us to see that each of us is an agent with the ability to actively seek inspiration and knowledge through the Spirit, rather than merely being passive recipients or objects who are acted upon or told what to do.

This especially caught my attention because I have been thinking about the power of agency, being an agent, in recent weeks, and discussing it with others. I have felt more centered during these chaotic times when I remember that, while I can't control anyone else's agency, and I can't control most

circumstances, I can control how and who I am



going to be in those circumstances. I find this in Christ's example. Even in the most challenging times, even when so many resisted his love and mercy, He chose to be the greatest example of love and mercy. He did not live in reactionary mode, depending on people agreeing or things working out to make it easy. His lifelong practice of being love and mercy led him to reveal the ultimate act of the Atonement, becoming one with all of us in our pain and sorrow and loss and hope, being able to do this because he loves us so completely. This act, this revelation of God's love and mercy for us, no matter who we are, no matter what we do, has power to save, not because it overrides my agency and demands compliance, but because I am overcome by this love, my heart is broken open by it, and filled with inspiration and transformative hope. I am inspired to be an agent to choose to follow this example, even when much challenges it. Even in the darkest, most difficult moments, when I feel the presence of God's love, the choice to follow it is clear, and stronger because it is my choice.

This is why I have come to cherish the message of Easter, and the observance of the events of Holy Week. I am including some ward and stake events in the newsletter (especially with music) for gaining a deeper experience as we approach General Conference, Holy Week and our Easter Program.

Inspirational message for April - by Kim Roberts


